

## **BUILDING PLANS**

## **August 2024**

Construction activity in Windhoek increased in August 2024, with 222 building plans approved valued at N\$ 116.8 million, this translated into an 17.5% m/m increase and a 9.4% y/y increase when compared to August 2024 and August 2023 respectively. These approvals included 166 additions, commercial and industrial plans, 34 House plans, 0 pool plan, 1 public plan and 21 Wall plans. (See Table 1)

During the month under review 151 buildings were completed in Windhoek, with a total value of N\$ 67 million. This indicated an improvement when compared to July 2024, depicting a 9.4% m/m and 101% y/y increase. Completed additions, commercial and industrials accounted for 101, flats and houses 32, 0 pool and 18 walls. (See Table 1)

The overall number of building plans approved continues on a positive trajectory. The recent reduction in interest rates may further influence this upward trend, making financing more accessible and potentially leading to an increase in approved building plans.




Figure 1: Monthly Building Plans Approved Vs. Buildings Completed, Windhoek (August 2021 - August 2024)





Figure 2: Approved Building Plans by Category, August 2024

In August 2024, commercial plans contributed 49% to the total approved building plans, followed by additions, which accounted for 37% of the total value of approved plans. The Windhoek locality registered the highest value of approved commercial and house plans, with N\$ 24 million and N\$ 13 million, respectively.

Completed houses dominated, accounting for 36% of the total buildings completed in August 2024. The Otjomuise locality recorded the highest value at N\$ 5 million. Addition buildings comprised 33% of the total value of completed buildings, with Khomasdal contributing N\$ 7 million.

## Outlook

The construction sector in Namibia is poised for a cautiously optimistic outlook for the remainder of 2024, driven by a combination of reduced interest rates and a notable increase in residential building plans, particularly in areas like Khomasdal and Klein Windhoek. This trend reflects a growing demand for housing as population dynamics shift and urbanization continues.





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
