







HOSPITALITY STATISTICS: NATIONAL OCCUPANCY RATES FOR NAMIBIA

August 2024

1. Executive Summary

In August 2024, Namibia's national occupancy rate reached 63.02%, reflecting a 3.3% increase from July's rate of 59.74%. This indicates that, on average, 63 out of every 100 available rooms were occupied during the month. The rise in occupancy rates from July to August 2024 highlights a positive trend for the tourism sector. Notably, the occupancy rate for Namibian citizens was 17.55%, indicating an increasing engagement of locals in the tourism industry.

2. Analysis


Occupancy rates varied significantly across regions. The Central region reported the highest rate at 70.42%, followed by the Southern region at 66.22%, and the Coastal region at 51.88%. However, the August 2024 occupancy rate of 60.78% represents a decrease of 6.22% compared to the same month in 2019.

Visitors from Germany, Austria, and Switzerland (D, CH, A) continued to dominate the market, accounting for 31.68% of total occupancy in August 2024. Among accommodation types, hotels with over 30 rooms recorded the highest occupancy rate at 64.80%, followed closely by lodges at 66.63%, and tented camps at 69.70%. In contrast, backpacker accommodations and guest farms showed significantly lower occupancy rates.

Leisure travel was the primary driver of overnight stays, accounting for 92.91% nationally, suggesting a strong focus on tourism in this segment. The Northern region had the highest occupancy rate at 70.42%, while the Coastal region, with 66.22%, also performed well. In contrast, the Central region had the lowest rate at 51.88%.


Leisure travel dominated occupancy rates in all regions, particularly in the Northern and Coastal areas, where rates exceeded 90%. Business travel accounted for only a small fraction of occupancy, with the Coastal region at 1.72% and the Northern region at 0.86%. Nationally, business-related stays constituted just 6.48%, and conference usage was minimal at 0.61%.

Figure 1: National Occupancy Rates, Namibia (August 2023- August 2024)




